A user-friendly guide to joining the Electoral Roll 2024

St Aidan's, Penn — St Joseph's, Merry Hill — St. Philip's, Bradmore.

"What is the electoral roll....? *Why* do you need one....? *How* do I join it....? *Should* I join it....? *Who* can be on it...? Should I be on it....?"

These questions, and many more, often crop up each year around the Annual General Meeting. With good reason too! Combine the complexity of Church of England law with a number of new people with little or no experience of church, let alone the Church of England, and you'll see why.

The bottom line is this. If you attend one of the churches in Penn Fields Parish regularly, and would like to declare and grow in your commitment to God's work in this part of Wolverhampton, then you may like to join the electoral roll.

"I belong "

Electoral Rolls should provide a true indication of the real membership and strength of the church both locally and nationally. Putting your name on the roll is a way of saying "I belong"; it is an act of commitment to your local church and to the church as a whole. It is also an important statement of witness, and a step along the path of discipleship. With your name on the electoral roll the strength of the church can be seen in the parish, the city, and the diocese.

"I serve...."

Joining the electoral roll opens up the way for greater involvement in the life of the church, at deanery, diocesan and national levels. You become entitled to vote at the Annual General Meeting, and become eligible to join the church committees and PCC.

"I support...."

Joining the electoral roll is also a statement of active and ongoing support for the church. This may mean different things for different people, but includes aspiring towards our desire to pursue the Christian life outlined in our core values as a parish.

• Those who become 16 during the next 12 months may complete the form, and become eligible to be entered on the Roll on their sixteenth birthday.

1. The only churches at present in communion with the Church of England are other Anglican Churches and certain foreign churches.

2. Membership of the electoral roll is also open to members in good standing of a Church not in communion with the Church of England which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity where those members are also prepared to declare themselves to be members of the Church Of England.

3. Every six years a new roll is prepared and those on the previous roll are informed so that they can reapply. If you are not resident in the parish but were on the roll as an habitual worshipper and have been prevented by sickness or absence or other essential reason from worshipping for the past six months, you may write "would. before have habitually attended" on the form and add "but was prevented from doing so because....." and then state the reason.

For inclusion on the electoral roll of the 2023 Annual General Meeting this form must be completed and returned to the office by **Sunday, 5th April** at the latest.
